History of the CCA

hip and token collectors have been around as long as casinos have, but it wasn't until the 1980s that collectors began talking with each other on a regular basis and dealers began to concentrate on casino material. Before the 1980s, chips and tokens could be found outside of casinos only as oddities: a few chips or tokens mixed in with a coin dealer's stock, or a few chips at an antiques shop or garage sale.

Two early chip dealers published short-lived newsletters, and a contributor to one of them was Archie Black, who lived not far from the relatively new casino gaming jurisdiction of Atlantic City, NJ. When the second of the two dealer newsletters ceased publication, Black, a chip collector with a long history of coin collecting and organizing coin clubs, decided to test the waters to see whether or not there might be sufficient interest to organize a chip and token collectors club similar to the coin clubs he had participated in. Late in 1987, Archie wrote to a number of collectors who appeared on the newsletter's subscriber list, inquiring about interest in an organized club.

The first issue of what would eventually become "Casino Chip & Token News", the quarterly magazine of the Casino Chip & Gaming Token Collectors Club at over 100 pages per issue appeared in January 1988, and was entitled "Atlantic City Chip & Token Newsletter." The five page newsletter was the creation of Archie Black, who began publishing his newsletter quarterly including news and history of the relatively new (10 years old) Atlantic City casino industry.

The response to the survey Black included in his first issue was overwhelmingly in favor of establishing a formal club, and the Casino Chip & Gaming Token Collectors Club was a reality. The initial group of collectors numbered about 20, but the charter membership was extended to the first 100 members. That goal was passed immediately after the Club's first annual meeting at the American Numismatic Association convention in Cincinnati, Ohio, that July.

The hobby expanded exponentially into literally every aspect of gaming in America and in fact across the entire world. No item too small or too large that had an identifiable logo or casino name attached to it went uncollected!

Items that became collectible included poker chips, casino chips, antique gaming chips, dice, match books, ashtrays, postcards, napkins, coasters, menus, plaques, silver strikes. The joke is that there is nothing out of bounds and people do in fact collect things that the average person would simply say, "You are kidding!" Table layouts for roulette, blackjack and craps, actual signs from the casinos, the glass fronts to slot machines, and of course the slot machines themselves!

The first (organizing) convention took place at the ANA convention in Cincinnati, Ohio on July 23, 1988. The first 5 conventions took place at the American Numismatic Association meetings! The first true CC>CC convention took place at the Aladdin Hotel, Las Vegas, in May of 1993!








Poker Tournament

THE JOSEPHINE STORY

In 2011 Robert Eisenstadt purchased the most extraordinary set of ivory poker chips at a small East Coast auction. He only knew two things about the set at the time of purchase: "Josephine" was the name of a ship and it was the most beautiful and complete set he had ever seen.

Robert teamed up with club member Richard Hanover who had an extensive collection of ivory chips and was able to offer his assistance. Between them they uncovered the major details behind the set.

The set was made in 1896 for Peter Arrell Browne Widener better known as P.A.B. Widener, one of the 100 richest men in the United States. He owned a 225 foot family authorized Gabe Fajuri owner of Potter & yacht called "Josephine" named after his wife and the set also called "Josephine" resided in the "CAPT. BIRTH" according to the inscription on the key tob to the case. Widener was part owner of the "White Star" line thus the white star in the center of the burgee, his personal flag. His son and grandson perished on the Titanic. One has to wonder who sat at the poker table with Widener and played with these beauties?

The tiger oak case has three pull out tiers holding 699 chips There is one \$5 chip mysteriously missing. The case has a working lock and key. The chips are 11/2"D and are beautifully hand painted and

scrimshawed on both sides. There are 100 white \$1, 99 red \$5, 150 blue \$10, 150 burgundy \$25, 100 orange \$50 and 100 lavender \$100. A lovely brass embossed plaque is on the lid of the box with three hand painted burgees (yacht flags).

A few years after Robert purchased the set I had an opportunity to view if and was dumbstruck by its magnificence. It is without a doubt the finest set of ivories known both in beauty and provenance. Many collectors tried to pry the set away from Robert but none were successful as he held firm to his not for sale rule.

On June 5th, 2020 Robert passed away and the Potter Auctions in Chicago to auction his extensive collection. Gabe decided because of certain legalities surrounding the sale of ivory items to no longer list them in his auctions. He returned the set to the family. In December of 2022 I was fortunate through Gabe's help to purchase the set from the family. I did not want to break up the set but after many attempts to sell the entire set intact there were no buyers. Sets of six chips are now being offered as well as singles of the \$10's and \$25's. A limited number of collectors will now have the buying opportunity of owning an extraordinary piece of history.

My Mom, Pualani Mossman Kaiinapau Avon was the face and heart of Hawaii for 90 years. We honor her this month on what would have been her 100th birthday. 
