The ChipGuide, World's Largest Casino Memorabilia Database, Honored by Las Vegas City and County Officials


Proclamations by Mayor Berkley and Clark County Commissioners celebrate ChipGuide's 25th anniversary and unique contribution to gaming industry


Proclamation to the Casino Collectible

Anniversary as a pivotal online resource and an invaluable asset to enthusiasts and historians alike. That complimented

the Board of Commissioners of Clark County's proclamation that also officially recognized today as ChipGuide Day, celebrating the online database's valuable contribution to Las Vegas and the casino gaming industry.



Since 1638, there have been more than 32,000 recognized casinos that have operated worldwide.

And for 25 years the ChipGuide has been cataloging and capturing images of gaming chips, tokens and





associated memorabilia from these open (and closed)
casinos all across the globe. Under the direction of the

Museum of Gaming History (MoGH), an educational
project of the CCA, and with the help of club members and
contributors, the non-profit organization has painstakingly



built an online database of photos of over 332,000 casino items. The ChipGuide covers only fact-based gaming chip and casino memorable information – subjective material such as monetary value is not included.

The CCA and the MoGH are hosting the world's largest casino chip and collectibles show that starts today and runs through Saturday in Exhibit Hall D at the South Point Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas. It is the greatest single-location collection of artifacts and mementos, with over 40 worldwide dealers on hand to offer attendees the unique opportunity to examine, buy, sell, or trade casino memorabilia. And for the low price of admission, \$10 max (not to mention free parking and no traffic hassles), it's a huge entertainment value. The event is open to the public and includes a multitude of fascinating displays, seminars, auctions and casino gaming celebrities.
